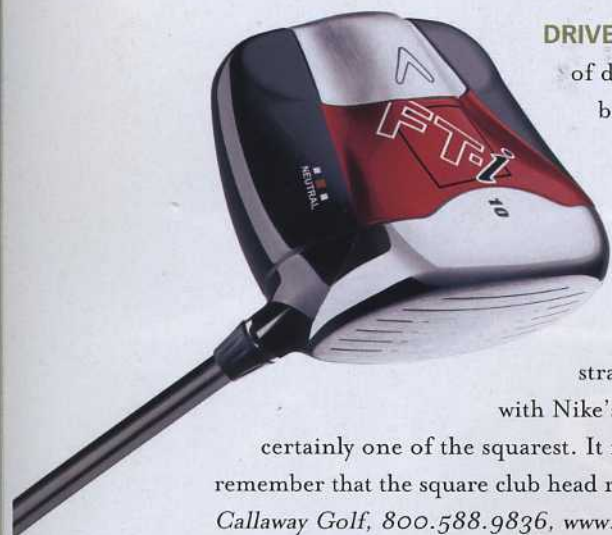

**Nevada's News** Roughly 50 miles north of Las Vegas, the beginnings of what will become the state's largest master-planned community (150,000 homes on 43,000 acres) are growing out of the ancient sea floor. The **Coyote Springs** development (shown) along Highway 93 is zoned for up to 15 golf courses to go along with those 150,000 homes; and it will also become the Western home of the PGA of America—the PGA Village at Coyote Springs. Before long, its first course, a Jack Nicklaus Signature design, will be complete.

But when Coyote Springs was still just barren desert, its developer Harvey Whittemore was already creating **The Resort at Red Hawk in Reno**, where the Robert Trent Jones Jr. Lakes Course and the Hale Irwin Signature Hills Course have been hosting golfers both in the summer and in the winter after runs down the nearby Tahoe slopes. With the private Hills Course and the public Lakes Course, Whittemore has proven he can build residential, resort and golf development of great quality.
